3-0 PLA legislative vote victories against the ABC!

The Political and Legislative Affairs Department would like to inform you on Monday, June 13th, the House of Representatives held its **third** vote on PLAs in approximately a four month timeframe—second in two weeks.

As part of the 2012 Military Construction and Veterans Affairs Appropriations Act, Rep. Steve LaTourette (R-OH) offered a pro-PLA amendment. Originally, the bill contained anti-PLA language, defunding the President's pro-PLA Executive Order. The Department is happy to announce we won the vote. The anti-PLA language was successfully removed--making us 3-0 on PLA votes this Congress.

However, it was only by one vote, 204-203.

The pro-PLA amendment had the support of 27 Republican and 177 Democrats.
